Outcomes and Benefits for Participants

This programme will help the participants to have a better understanding of different types of communities across Cumbria; their diverse cultures, inequalities and strengths, with an introduction to tackling hate crime and reducing reoffending.

The programme tackles prejudice, reduces hate crime and hate incidents, and fosters good relations by helping individuals to reflect on actions and attitudes that harm people from diverse communities.
